The existing fire equipment and vehicles at Lephalale does not meet the current challenges faced by the local and District Municipality

Waterberg District Municipality requires fire equipment in order to render fire and rescue services in the Lephalale municipal jurisdiction as well as the Waterberg District

PURPOSE / OBJECTIVES OF THE PROJECT

To render fire safety, rescue operations and special services within the municipal boundaries and if required, to give emergency support within the Waterberg District.

SCOPE OF WORK

A. 1x Lephalale- Refurbishment of Iveco Fire Truck

This specification provides for the refurbishment of Iveco Fire Truck. The apparatus shall be delivered to the Waterberg District Municipality.

B. DEFECTS

- i) Tank leaks,
- ii) Cracks between the superstructure and the chassis,
- iii) Defective gearbox

- iv) Defective accelerator,
- v) Head lights not working properly

C. GUARANTEE/WARRANTY

Bidders shall submit full details of their guarantee commitments, indicating in all respects the extent thereof. If no guarantee is stated it will be 24 months to lifetime.

The guarantee period shall commence as from the official handover date of the apparatus, and if any discrepancies should arise during the handover date on the apparatus, then WDM will be advised of.

All Guarantee commitments shall be submitted with the tender documents.

Bidders shall also undertake to ensure that the Client Satisfactory after sales and Maintenance or Free Support is provided for a period 2 years, this should be included in the pricing structure/quote.

PROJECT COSTS/PRICING SCHEDULE AND PAYMENT MILESTONE

Service providers are expected to provide an estimate of disbursements in their proposal and indicate payment at specific milestones successfully completed. The project cost must be inclusive of **all chargeable costs to the municipality**. The payment milestone will be agreed to with the appointed Service Provider. The WDM will within 30 days period after presentation of an approved invoice of the refurbished Fire Truck make payment to the service provider. Please note that 100% payment will be made by WDM on delivery of Iveco Fire Truck for Lephalale to WDM's satisfaction.

The proposal must be fixed cost and remain valid for 90 days after the closing date of the tender submissions. The rate of exchange of this bid is not subject to any foreign currency and the prize must be firm.

N.B. Price breakdown schedule with all items/equipment to be supplied/repaired by the service provider and attached to this tender.

SKILLS REQUIRED / EXPERTISE REQUIREMENTS

The successful supplier must have the following qualifications:-

Knowledgeable of good quality fire-fighting apparatus.

The municipality has the right to request a presentation or submission of samples if deemed necessary after closing of the tender.

DELIVERY TIME FRAME

The project is expected to be completed in **Four (04) months** from the date of the acceptance of the appointment letter. The service provider will be required to commence with the assignment immediately upon appointment and must supply the municipality with a detailed revised work schedule with time frames.

REPORTING

The successful bidder will be expected to submit a detailed report to WDM on a monthly basis (1 copy to Project Manager and another copy to Supply Chain Management Unit). The monthly reports must be submitted not later than the 07^{th} of every month after the awarding of the Bid by the Client/WDM.

The service provider must report on monthly basis to WDM on progress made. During the monthly feedback meetings 80% of the proposed team must be present in all meetings.

EVALUATION CRITERIA

2. DEFINITIONS

- 2.1 "all applicable taxes" includes value-added tax, pay as you earn, income tax, unemployment insurance fund contributions and skills development levies;
- 2.2 **"B-BBEE"** means broad-based black economic empowerment as defined in section 1 of the Broad Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- 2.3 "B-BBEE status level of contributor" means the B-BBEE status received by a measured entity based

on its overall performance using the relevant scorecard contained in the Codes of Good Practice on Black Economic Empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;

- 2.4 "bid" means a written offer in a prescribed or stipulated form in response to an invitation by an organ of state for the provision of services, works or goods, through price quotations, advertised competitive bidding processes or proposals;
- 2.5 **"Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act"** means the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 (Act No. 53 of 2003);
- 2.6 "comparative price" means the price after the factors of a non-firm price and all unconditional discounts that can be utilized have been taken into consideration;
- 2.7 "consortium or joint venture" means an association of persons for the purpose of combining their expertise, property, capital, efforts, skill and knowledge in an activity for the execution of a contract;
- 2.8 "contract" means the agreement that results from the acceptance of a bid by an organ of state;
- 2.9 "EME" means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of R5 million or less .
- 2.10 "Firm price" means the price that is only subject to adjustments in accordance with the actual increase or decrease resulting from the change, imposition, or abolition of customs or excise duty and any other duty, levy, or tax, which, in terms of the law or regulation, is binding on the contractor and demonstrably has an influence on the price of any supplies, or the rendering costs of any service, for the execution of the contract;
- 2.11 "functionality" means the measurement according to predetermined norms, as set out in the bid documents, of a service or commodity that is designed to be practical and useful, working or operating, taking into account, among other factors, the quality, reliability, viability and durability of a service and the technical capacity and ability of a bidder;
- 2.12 "non-firm prices" means all prices other than "firm" prices;
- 2.13 "person" includes a juristic person;
- 2.14 "rand value" means the total estimated value of a contract in South African currency, calculated at the time of bid invitations, and includes all applicable taxes and excise duties;
- 2.15 "sub-contract" means the primary contractor's assigning, leasing, making out work to, or employing, another person to support such primary contractor in the execution of part of a project in terms of the contract;
- 2.16 "total revenue" bears the same meaning assigned to this expression in the Codes of Good Practice on Black Economic Empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act and promulgated in the *Government Gazette* on 9 February 2007;
- 2.17 "trust" means the arrangement through which the property of one person is made over or bequeathed to a trustee to administer such property for the benefit of another person; and

3. ADJUDICATION USING A POINT SYSTEM

- The bidder obtaining the highest number of total points will be awarded the contract.
- Preference points shall be calculated after prices have been brought to a comparative basis taking into account all factors of non-firm prices and all unconditional discounts;.
- Points scored must be rounded off to the nearest 2 decimal places.

- In the event that two or more bids have scored equal total points, the successful bid must be the one scoring the highest number of preference points for B-BBEE.
- However, when functionality is part of the evaluation process and two or more bids have scored equal points including equal preference points for B-BBEE, the successful bid must be the one scoring the highest score for functionality.
- 3.6 Should two or more bids be equal in all respects, the award shall be decided by the drawing of lots.

4. POINTS AWARDED FOR PRICE

4.1 THE 80/20 OR 90/10 PREFERENCE POINT SYSTEMS

- Bidders other than EMEs must submit their original and valid B-BBEE status level verification certificate or 5.3 a certified copy thereof, substantiating their B-BBEE rating issued by a Registered Auditor approved by IRBA or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS.
- A trust, consortium or joint venture, will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as a legal entity, 5.4 provided that the entity submits their B-BBEE status level certificate.
- A trust, consortium or joint venture will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as an unincorporated 5.5 entity, provided that the entity submits their consolidated B-BBEE scorecard as if they were a group structure and that such a consolidated B-BBEE scorecard is prepared for every separate bid.
